

PREVENTION OF DISEASE/INFECTION TRANSMISSION

The school district shall endeavor to take such actions and precautions to prevent the spread of disease and/or infection in its schools as are recommended by the State and County Departments of Health. Actions taken with respect to students or employees will be consistent with rights afforded individuals under state and federal statutory, regulatory and constitutional provisions. Each case of said student or staff member will be treated on an individual basis.

The Superintendent or his/her designee will be responsible for determining the information to be disseminated to staff, parents, and community when a communicable disease is identified or suspected in the school setting.

The district will continue to use information from available resources, which may include the National Center for Disease Control and the Wyoming State Department of Health to revise and adopt its policies and procedures. In that regard, the District has adopted a bloodborne pathogen exposure control plan consistent with OSHA standards and provides training to staff regarding the bloodborne pathogen exposure control plan consistent with the risk of exposure that staff are subject to. The bloodborne pathogen exposure control plan will incorporate OSHA regulations applicable to bloodborne pathogens in the school environment. Appropriate school district personnel, designated by the superintendent, shall be familiar with the applicable OSHA regulations and provide appropriate training as needed to comply with the OSHA regulations and changes to those regulations.
