All employees are obligated to be knowledgeable of the standards applicable to his/her area or job, and to abide by them. Supervisors must instill a positive attitude regarding safety awareness in their subordinates through personal adherence, personal contact, training and regularly scheduled safety meetings. It is the duty of all employees to perform their work with maximum regard for the safety of themselves and co-workers.

The Wyoming Occupational Safety and Health Rules and Regulations, federal and state regulations, and school district policies are based on past experience and current standards, and are also an integral part of the company's personnel policies.
