Classes for Grades K-1:

Grades K-1 Monday/Wednesday: Story Starters

Students are given a large kit of LEGOs which includes dozens of minifigs, accessories, bricks, blocks and more, to build interactive storyboards. They cultivate their speaking skills by presenting their stories to their classmates.

Grades K-1 Tuesday/Thursday: You Be The Scientist

Science experiments galore!! In this class, students will engage in science experiments, mostly involving chemistry, to broaden their knowledge of the scientific method and chemistry. Students will make real world connections through fun science experiments and gain tools to create a lifelong appreciation and understanding of science.

Classes for Grades 2-3:

Grades 2-3 Monday/Wednesday: Coding

In this class students will be exploring the world of computer coding. They will log on to sites like code.org, tynker.com, codeable.io/, and more, to learn the language of computers.

Grades 2-3 Tuesday/Thursday: Destination Imagination

In this class students will be completing Destination Imagination Instant Challenges, where they will be asked to complete tasks, in a group setting, using only a limited amount of supplies. Some tasks involve building a structure, and some may involve improvisational performances.

Classes for Grades 4-5:

Grades 4-5 Monday/Wednesday: Observing Aquariums

In this class, "students build and maintain aquariums that become, over several weeks, diverse underwater ecosystems. Students can observe food chains, how populations change, and how life cycles unfold. One by one, organisms are introduced into freshwater habitats: two types of aquatic plants, tropical fish, pond snails, algae, and tiny crustaceans called daphnia. Students examine each one to discover how it is suited to life underwater." (deltaeducation.com)

Grades 4-5 Tuesday/Thursday: Financial Education

In this class, students will gain an understanding of their personal finances. They will be learning about the benefits of saving money throughout their lifetime, keeping their debt low, and general financial information. Financial awareness is a must for young people in our world of instant credit!
