You'll not only learn about different career paths but also get a chance to see what it really takes to make them happen. We'll take trips to Sheridan College, where you'll meet professionals, explore hands-on programs, and even go home with some cool swag! Whether you dream of becoming a nurse, dental hygienist, massage therapist, or something else entirely, this club will open the door to exciting possibilities.



History Day (T/Th) -

Do you want to make a documentary, design a website, or even create a skit with your friends—and then submit it to a statewide competition? With the History Day Club, you can do all this and more! Join other students who love history (or just love creating cool projects) and work on a project of your choice. You'll first compete locally in March 2026, with winners moving on to the Wyoming History Day competition in Laramie in April 2026. And who knows—your project might even qualify for National History Day in Maryland next summer! (One SJHS student made it to Nationals in 2023!) This is your chance to be creative, dive into history, and show your work on a big stage!

BRONC Study Club - Literacy (T/Th)

Calligraphy (T/Th):
